

## STAMBAUGH TOWNSHIP BOARD

### Regular Meeting

The meeting of the Stambaugh Township Board was called to order by Supervisor Isaacson on June 14, 2023, at 7:02 p.m. at the Stambaugh Township Hall.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Roll call was taken with Supervisor Isaacson, Treasurer Rogers, Clerk Christensen and Trustees Pangrazzi and Stolberg in attendance. Water Supervisor, Wyatt Johnson, was absent because of an ongoing water issue.

The minutes were read from the May 10, 2023, meeting and accepted as read.

Clerk Christensen read the bills for the month and Trustee Stolberg made a motion to approve the bills with a second by Trustee Pangrazzi. Bills were approved.

Treasurer Rogers read the Treasurer's report which was accepted as presented.

Supervisor Isaacson asked for a moment of silence in recognition of the passing of Theresa Baumgartner who had served as our Clerk for 27 years.

Zach Hautala with the Iron County Economic Chamber Alliance reported that the Crystal Falls housing development continues to move forward. The title work was ordered and came back clear. The job fair was well attended with good participation from the attendees. The final Business after Hours took place at the Iron River Country Club with a good turnout.

Christian Bensen with Wickwire presented a Resolution of Authorization to apply for the Sparks Grant for improvements at Holmes Park. Treasurer Rogers made a motion to accept this resolution with a second from Trustee Stolberg. Motion carried.

Supervisor Isaacson reported that the Krans Road project was back on for \$44,654.94. Stambaugh Township's responsibility for this project is a one-time payment of \$22,327.47.

Some overlayment will be done on Hagerman Lake Road over the rough areas and University Road will be worked on in the early fall with FA Industrial winning the bid.

Chloride has been put on some roads to control dust due to the lack of rain.

Supervisor Isaacson reported that the Windsor Center is doing well and that the Cemetery Board discussed the need for additional assessment fees for the township as a result of the increase in population.

Everything is set for the township clean-up day on June 24<sup>th</sup> at the hall from 8—noon.

Resident, John Nieminen, inquired if a decision had been made by the County Commissioners to keep 911 local. Zach Hautala had been at the meeting and stated that a special meeting will be taking place to decide this matter.

Supervisor Isaacson read the zoning permits.

Our next regular meeting will be on July 12, 2023.

Treasurer Rogers made a motion to adjourn the meeting with a second from Trustee Pangrazzi.

Meeting adjourned at 7:45 p.m.
