

STAMBAUGH TOWNSHIP BOARD

Regular Meeting

The meeting of the Stambaugh Township Board was called to order by Supervisor Isaacson on October 8, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. at the Stambaugh Township Hall.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Roll call was taken with Supervisor Isaacson, Clerk Christensen, Treasurer Rogers and Trustees Pangrazzi and Stolberg in attendance. Also present was Water Supervisor, Wyatt Johnson.

The minutes were read by Clerk Christensen from the September 10, 2025, meeting and accepted as read.

Clerk Christensen read the bills for the month. Trustee Stolberg made a motion to approve the bills with a second from Treasurer Rogers. Motion carried.

Treasurer Rogers read the Treasurer's report which was accepted as presented.

Zach Hautala with ICECA reported that the annual Harvest and Haunt was well attended with 2,500 to 3,000 attendees on a beautiful fall day. Also had a record number of sponsors with 39 which makes this event possible. Business After Hours returns October 29th at the Alpha MI Brewery. The December BAH will be held at the Iron County Museum in conjunction with the Christmas Galleria on December 3rd. The second round of the Fast Track grant program is being developed with applications tentatively due in early November. The boardwalk redo project is completed with the final updates to be finished soon.

Residents of the River Country Estates inquired about the status of the process regarding their barking dog situation at 112 Whitetail Lane. Supervisor Isaacson stated that a ticket was served with a deadline of October 9th to respond. The violation of noise ordinance is a municipal civil action and he has been in contact with the Judge regarding this matter. A fine can be served in lieu of lack of response with the amount to be determined. Residents have stated that the Iron County Sheriff's Department will not assist with this matter.

Supervisor Johnson reported that all of the propane tanks are in their respective locations and are all now owned by the Township. Two waterline leaks were repaired: one by Osterlund Road and the other by the Bass Lake boat landing. The Fall Water Conference went well. We are receiving good results from the water analysis that we were required to administer.

Supervisor Isaacson reported that the Hagerman Lake blacktopping was partially complete and the W. Brule Lake Road would be started soon.

Treasurer Rogers proposed a motion to allow our county to Opt Out of having a County Designated Assessor. Trustee Stolberg seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Jill Walsh, our Short-Term Rental Ordinance coordinator has begun compiling a list of rentals in the Township.

All is well at the Windsor Center, Holmes Park and the WIC Fire Department.

Supervisor Isaacson read the zoning permits.

Treasurer Rogers made a motion to adjourn with a second from Trustee Pangrazzi. Meeting adjourned at 8:22 p.m.

The next meeting will take place on Wednesday, November 12, 2025.
