

# STAMBAUGH TOWNSHIP BOARD

## Regular Meeting

The meeting of the Stambaugh Township Board was called to order by Supervisor Isaacson on April 8, 2026, at 7:00 p.m. at the Stambaugh Township Hall.

The Pledge of Allegiance was said.

Roll call was taken with Supervisor Isaacson, Clerk Christensen, Treasurer Rogers and Trustees Pangrazzi and Stolberg in attendance. Water Supervisor, Wyatt Johnson, was also present along with eighteen residents.

Supervisor Isaacson reviewed the proposed budget for 2026—2027. Treasurer Rogers made a motion to accept the budget with a second from Trustee Pangrazzi. Motion carried.

The minutes were read by Clerk Christensen from the March 11, 2026, meeting and accepted as read.

Clerk Christensen read the bills for the month. Trustee Stolberg made a motion to approve the bills with a second from Treasurer Rogers. Motion carried.

Treasurer Rogers read the Treasurer's report which was accepted as presented.

After a number of months, the River Country Estates residents were complaining again of the neighbor's barking dogs and inquiring about the development of a dog ordinance. Supervisor Isaacson stated that the County has an adopted dog ordinance which is from the State and it would override anything at the township level. The residents inquired about developing an ordinance limiting the number of dogs an individual can own. Discussion followed. Supervisor Isaacson stated that the township would continue to issue tickets as necessary following the proper procedure.

Zach Hautala with ICECA reported that they would be hosting a job fair for both Forest Park and West Iron students on April 14<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup>. The first edition of their monthly newsletter was released entitled the "Iron Advantage". Fast Track Grant applications will be accepted in April with this being the 5<sup>th</sup> year of existence for this program. Also, a reminder that job postings for various businesses are listed on a number of websites in the County.

Supervisor Johnson reported that the 455' boring near Bass Lake was completed for a total of \$6,500. Kleiman Well repaired the #2 pump at Indian Lake and it is running smoothly. The street light in the parking lot by the hall was fixed. The State Inspector was here and voiced some concern with the underground tank by Indian Lake.

Supervisor Johnson also stated that he has setup accounts for ordering supplies with Ferguson and Etna Supply as a back up to Core & Main. Town & Country Ford contact said that they have a line on another truck that they should have delivered to them in two weeks.

In discussion regarding waterline repairs/replacement, Supervisor Johnson stated that the line starting at Stromberg Road and going down Baumgartner Road would be a good place to begin with this project.

The Holmes Park improvement project is estimated at \$287,300.

Supervisor Isaacson read the zoning permits.

Our next regular meeting will be held on May 13, 2026.

Treasurer Rogers made a motion to adjourn the meeting with a second from Trustee Pangrazzi. Meeting adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
